### PRESIDENTS DAY



March 19<sup>th</sup> on the Federal level is still the day to honor George Washington's birthday. Some of us probably remember from our early school days that we celebrated Washington's birthday on February 22, it was national holiday. Many states also celebrated Abraham Lincoln's birthday on February 12 although it was not a national holiday. In 1885, Congress designated February 22, Washington's birthday, as a holiday for all federal workers. It was the first federal holiday that honored an individual's birth date. Nearly a century later, in 1971, the Uniform Monday Holiday Law changed the date to the third Monday in February. The position of the holiday between the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and George Washington morphed, probably for commercial reasons, into what is now commonly known as President's Day. Unfortunately, this may have resulted in not specifically recognizing these great presidents and what impact they had

on the course of our nation. Founding Father George Washington, led the Continental Army to victory in the American Revolutionary War, presided at the Constitutional Convention of 1787, and was the first U.S. president. Abraham Lincoln led the nation through the American Civil War, preserved the Union, abolished slavery, bolstered the federal government, and modernized the U.S. economy. So, maybe this month we can learn about these two Presidents, put ourselves in their shoes and remember how they improved our country for the greater good.

## **INFORMATION FROM JANUARY 12<sup>TH</sup> TOWN HALL MEETING**

**Landscaping** - A representative from Brightview Landscaping addressed shareholders after the January 12, 2024 Board Meeting. They recognized there are numerous issues that need to be addressed and, in most cases, can be related to inadequate management and oversight, Brightview is committed to resolving them. The issues identified could be related to oversight and the training and quality of the individual workers. Several residents spoke to identify issues such as, damaged skirting, inadequate trimming and mowing, Some shareholders expressed disappointment in the time it takes to resolve their problems. Concerns over the condition of the front hedges due to white fly infestation were expressed. The hedges have been treated four times and further recommendations will be forthcoming shortly to address the issue and bring the hedges back to a healthy state. Shareholders were encouraged to continue to identify issues to Charles and Brightview management. Some efforts underway, include increased management presence on site, training and smaller lawn mowers.

**Meet the Candidates** - Charles moderated a forum so that residents had an opportunity to meet the five candidates running for the three open board positions. The candidates are, Ron Hysell, Jeff Pfeiffer, Pat St. John, Dave Malady and Rick Maxfield. Charles asked each candidate to respond to questions that were developed by him and submitted by some shareholders. The questions were related to best character traits, budget concerns, seasonal residents serving on board, willingness to serve in officer positions, and why they should be elected. Candidates were given time to respond to each of the topics. More specific information on each candidate can be found in the Annual Meeting information packet.

## **ANNUAL MEETING INFORMATION**

The annual ESC shareholder's meeting is scheduled for Friday, February 9th at 9:30am. Packets containing the agenda, voting ballots, candidate info sheet, envelopes and proxy were delivered directly to shareholders by designated street captains. Shareholders not available to obtain them in person received theirs in the mail addressed to their official address on file. Shareholders who have opted for electronic notification have received the same information electronically.

Shareholders who have registered for electronic voting have been provided with instructions on how to complete their ballots.
