 **ST. PATRICK'S DAY** 

Sunday, March 17th is the feast day of St. Patrick, the Patron Saint of Ireland, recognized by the Irish as converting Ireland to Christianity. He established many churches, monasteries and schools in Ireland. He is also considered to be the figurehead of many Irish legends, in particular, driving the snakes out of Ireland, although evidence (lack of snake fossils) suggests that snakes never inhabited the “Emerald Isle”. It appears that emigrants to the United States transformed St. Patrick’s day into a celebration of all things Irish. Parades, green beer, corn beef and cabbage, the wearing of green, dyeing rivers green are some of these examples. Many of us have raised a “pint” in celebration of this day.

 **EASTER** 

One of the most important Christian holidays commemorates the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead 3 days after his death by Crucifixion. Easter 2024 will be observed on **Sunday, March 31st**. Easter is a “movable feast” that has a date change each year. Simply stated, Easter Sunday always occurs on the first Sunday following the full moon that occurs on or after the **March or spring equinox** (March 19, 2024). On Easter Sunday, millions of Christians worldwide celebrate Easter with special church services, music, sunrise services, candlelight services, flowers and the ringing of church bells. Easter processions are held in many countries. Many Christians view Easter as the greatest feast of the Church year. It is a day of joy and celebration to commemorate that Jesus Christ is risen, according to Christian belief.

Although Easter has an important religious significance, many children think of it as a time to get new spring clothes, to decorate eggs and to participate in Easter egg hunts where eggs are hidden by the Easter Bunny. Some children receive Easter baskets full of candy, snacks, and presents around this time of the year.
