## **HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2024:**

Where does the time go? It seems like just yesterday we were winding down from the 2024 Winter season, now here we are gearing up for the 2025 Winter season. Every day we see an increase in the number of residents in our park. Many of us will soon be celebrating Christmas with our family and friends.

The ESC Board has been working hard on your behalf. Our community never runs out of projects to do and to ensure that we never run out of projects, Mother Nature can always provide some excitement. This year we were very lucky in not having any major damage or problems resulting from Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton. There were some flooding issues resulting in ductwork replacement for a number of owners but it was not at the level that was experienced as a result of Hurricane Ian. The ESC facilities did have some minor damage which has been already corrected. By the time you read this the 2024 Hurricane season will be in our rearview mirror, officially ending November 30.

Thanks to the success of the Clubhouse Yard Sale, organized by Joyce and Ken Orris and supported by many volunteer shareholders, the profits were used to fund many projects, such as, the enhancement of the Dock area, including new Kayak racks, landscaping improvements outside the fence at the end of Jasper Drive, tables for the "Back Porch", library bookshelves, card room tables, mesh bags for Water Aerobic equipment and adding money to the Clubhouse blinds fund. Howard and Pam Loveless turned over profit from the "Monty and Friends Concert" to improve the Clubhouse sound system, and the Pickleball Club donated money to purchase the new table outside the ESC office. This type of generosity coupled with numerous shareholder volunteer hours for our many projects go a long way in keeping our Co-op assessments at a lower level.

The swimming pool project turned out to be a major undertaking. What started out as a coping replacement/repair mushroomed into coping ledge and pool resurfacing, (some of which was required to meet current code requirements) and new pool patio pavers. Adding to the project delays were permitting, material procurement and weather. The project was completed in late October and the pool is now in use. Shareholders should be pleased with the outcome. Some other projects completed this past year were, Maintenance Building painting, Clubhouse roof cleaning and repair, a new Clubhouse AC Unit, replacement of side boards at the bocce courts and horseshoe pits, and repair to Clubhouse floor paint. Also, it appears a lightning strike took out our surveillance cameras in our clubhouse and maintenance buildings along with some routers, monitors, and even the billiards room stereo. An insurance claim was submitted and most equipment has been replaced with newer state of the art equipment.

Projects that were started and will continue into the next year are water system leak detection, street light repairs (experimenting with solar lighting), swale and erosion issues at the east end (currently working with Collier County Stormwater Management), and investigation into the feasibility of fiber optic improvements for TV and Internet.

On November 15, 2024 the Board reviewed and approved the 2025 ESC Budget. The result is the maintenance fee due January 1, 2025 is now \$487 per quarter or \$1948 per year. This is a \$15.00 increase in the current Quarterly Assessment. In light of inflationary pressures, additions to the Reserve section of the budget and the need to address continuing problems, the increase was unavoidable. Payments can be made at any time. Please utilize the coupons provided in the Budget Meeting Notice mailing.

If you are planning to run for a Board position, on or before **January 5, 2025**, you must give WRITTEN notice, either by email attachment, mail, fax, or in person of your desire to run for the Board of Directors. This written notice should be addressed to the Enchanting Shores Co-operative, Inc., 17 Turquoise Ave, Naples, FL. 34114. You may use the **Notice of Intent to be a Candidate for the Enchanting Shores Cooperative Board of Directors** form for that purpose. You also may submit a **Candidate Information Sheet**, no larger than 8.5 inches by 11 inches, containing your qualifications. This information sheet must be submitted to the Co-operative no later than **January 10, 2024**. This sheet can be emailed as an email attachment, just not as content in an email message. Email to: **secretary@enchantingshores.com**

The **SECOND NOTICE** regarding the Annual Shareholder's Meeting will be sent out no less than 14 days prior to February 15, 2025 meeting date. Like the first notice it will be distributed to shareholders, by their preferred method (in-hand, mail or email). The SECOND NOTICE will include the complete agenda for the Annual Shareholders' Meeting, candidate information sheets, voting materials and any other material pertinent to the agenda. Materials and instructions will also be provided for both paper voting and electronic voting.

Also, in the recent mailing there is a survey that is requested to be completed by all ESC Shareholders by December 5. The survey is non-binding and basically requests shareholders to express whether they are interested in obtaining more information from investment companies that are inquiring about purchasing Enchanting Shores. The mailing has more detailed information and what is needed to submit your survey.

## FOR THE GOOD OF THE COMMUNITY

**Defibrillator** - There is a Defibrillator that can be used for emergency purposes. It is located to the left of the Clubhouse exit doors leading to the pool area. Please note its location as it can be used to save someone's life. Instructions for use are also included so training, although preferred, is not necessarily needed.

**Electronic Voting** - Last year the ability to vote electronically was made available to all shareholders and was used for voting for last year's Annual Shareholders Meeting. This system allowed the vote tallies to be made more efficiently. To date only 40% of the shareholders have signed up to use this system. This system is very easy to use and allows one to quickly vote. No more envelopes, stamps and trips to the mailbox. An informational session is being planned for the near future. If you would like to sign up for

electronic voting, contact our ESC secretary, Kelley, [secretary@enchantingshores.com](mailto:secretary@enchantingshores.com) or ESC president, Missy, [president@enchantingshores.com](mailto:president@enchantingshores.com). Manual voting will still be available.

**Electronic Distribution ESC Communications** - There is a form, *Shareholder Official Address and Telephone Form* that will allow shareholders to “Opt In”, if they so desire, to electronically receive notices, meeting agendas, written materials, photos, etc. All regulatory requirements regarding these communications would still be satisfied. It should be pointed out that shareholder, if they decide not to “Opt In”, will still receive **Mail Delivery** (to their official address on file) or **In-Hand Delivery** (to an address in ESC) for these documents. To date almost 50% of the shareholders have decided to “Opt In” resulting in savings for the ESC community. So, if you haven’t done so, please do to help reduce our mailing costs. The form can be obtained from the ESC office and the Office Staff or any Board member can assist in the completion.

**Water Consumption** – Water usage needs to be a concern of all. In addition to the importance of water conservation, the cost of Collier County supplied water continues to increase and is one of the largest expenses at ESC. A Board initiative to test each home for water leakage was initiated last year and will continue into 2025. Ensure that usage issues within your home (leaky faucets, running toilets and piping leaks) are promptly addressed. A testing device, along with instructions, is available at the ESC office to leak test your own plumbing. Lawn irrigation is addressed in Rules and Regulations (section 18) that specify the allowed operation, such as, watering days and duration (odd addresses Monday, Wednesday and Friday; even addresses Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday with a maximum duration time of 15 minutes). Please adhere to these requirements.

**Back Porch** - Our patio area known as the “Back Porch” is available for all shareholders to utilize for cookouts, parties and gatherings. You must fill out a reservation form for this area and can pick one up in the ESC office.

**Bears** – There appears to be an increase in the sightings of bears in Collier County, including our community. In most cases, they are simply looking for food. Ensure that all garbage is in bags and properly secured in sealed trash receptacles. Report all bear sightings and if you encounter a bear try to remain calm and back away to a safe area.

**Observe Speed Limits** – Along with the winter season comes an increase in the number of pedestrians, bicycles and vehicles. The speed limit posted throughout the park is **10 mph**. Numerous bicycles and electric bikes have been observed traveling around our park above and beyond the 10mph speed limit. As per our rules/regulations (section18a), this speed limit applies to all motor vehicles, bicycles and motorized bikes. There have been a few close calls and it's only a matter of time before someone gets hurt. Please observe the limit to ensure the safety of all. If you are not sure what 10 mph is, if you are traveling in a vehicle, you most likely will have to drive with your foot on the brake to slow to 10mph. Slow down Please!

**Free Home????** - Collier County has a terrific grant program for shareholders who have documentation from FEMA citing damage to your residence from Hurricane Ian. If you make less than \$56K per year you can qualify. ESC had the first shareholder qualify and they will be receiving a new home including appliances and rated for a category 3 hurricane, along with prepaid lodging while their current home is removed and replaced. Lee Corp is working with the county on this endeavor.
