Valentine's Day traditions in the United States include giving gifts, exchanging cards, and dining out, but what is the origin of Valentine's Day. Many believe that Lupercalia, the ancient Roman fertility festival held on February 15th, was the pre-cursor to our modern holiday. It's thought that Lupercalia took place to please the Roman fertility god, Lupercus. The Catholic church introduced the feast of St. Valentine on February 14th to counteract Lupercalia and put a religious spin on the day by using St. Valentine as its icon. One belief is that St. Valentine was a Catholic priest named Valentine who defied the Roman emperor Claudius II by performing wedding ceremonies for Roman soldiers. Claudius didn't want any distractions for his soldiers so he decreed that they not marry. The Roman Emperor imprisoned Valentine and later beheaded him on February 14th for refusing to forsake his faith, thus making him a "Saint" for his martyrdom. Of course, there is another legend that St. Valentine was a priest that was jailed for helping persecuted Christians. During his imprisonment he prayed to God for the blind daughter of the jailer. The daughter's sight was restored and on the night before Valentine was to be executed, he wrote a card to the daughter and signed it "Love, from your Valentine. To celebrate the martyrdom of Valentine, Pope Gelasius eradicated the festival of Lupercalia in the 5th century and established February 14th as a day of remembrance for St. Valentine. As time passed, Valentine's Day was a day to write love notes which in time turned into more elaborate cards and gifts of flowers. Later on, John Cadbury started selling his chocolates in heart shaped boxes and gifts of chocolates became part of the tradition. Like most of our holidays it became commercialized as it spread to the United States. Hallmark was the first to start commercially producing Valentine cards. It wasn't long before others jumped on the commercial bandwagon with their love-associated wares, from *Sweethearts* candy with their romantic messages, to flowers, cute teddy bears, diamond jewelry, romance movies, hotel suites, romantic dinners and wedding venues. And that is a brief Valentine's Day history.

PEOPLE YOU SHOULD KNOW

Each month, members of the Enchanting Shores community are highlighted in the Shorelines. This month, as a first, a couple is being highlighted. Cindy and Bill Voight are well known in the ESC Community for promoting and teaching line dancing but after meeting and chatting with Bill at a recent pancake breakfast I found another side of this couple that should be shared with the ESC community. After reading what follows you will see that one of their recent postings not only applies to their dance philosophy but also to how they live their lives... *It's not about who dances the best but who enjoys it the most.* That is something we all should ponder.



Cindy and Billy Voight reside at 10 Pearl Drive during the winter months. They are both native Missourians and began coming to ESC in 2014. "There are so many activities here at ESC, it's hard for me to pick a favorite", said Cindy, "but I especially enjoy pickleball, swimming laps, and playing cards in the Clubhouse."

"My favorite activity is going to Wiggins Beach on warm days," says Bill, "I love to go early in the morning and stay till sunset. It's especially fun when our kids and grandkids can come down on spring break." Bill and Cindy also enjoy exploring the various eco-systems in central and south Florida. "We especially like visiting areas sometimes referred to as "Old Florida." There's nothing quite like it anywhere in America," Bill states.

Cindy and Bill just celebrated their 10th wedding anniversary this past summer. They celebrated by going to see the Rolling Stones in Branson, Missouri. "Branson is a wonderful family vacation area, and I'd encourage anyone to check it out", said Bill. The couple are probably best known for teaching line dance in the ESC Clubhouse every Monday morning. In fact, Cindy and Bill met while ballroom dancing. To hear Bill tell the story, he chased after Cindy, quick-stepping all around the ballroom until finally the orchestra played a slow waltz and he was able to catch up to her and propose marriage! "The waltz is still our favorite dance," said Cindy. We also promote beginner dances with as few steps and turns as possible. This year I launched my own YouTube channel

with instructional dance videos. The goal is to make that tool available as a teaching aide. So far it seems to be working out well," said Bill. "There are many social benefits with dancing, and it is an excellent form of exercise as well as a way to help maintain mental acuity," added Cindy.

In addition to their winter activities at ESC, Cindy and Bill are regular Amtrak passenger train travelers. "We like to get a bedroom sleeper and travel in style," Bill said, "with Albuquerque being a favorite destination." In summer months Cindy enjoys pickleball in their hometown of Columbia, Missouri and Bill can often be seen dressed up in his Revolutionary War uniform as several of his Virginia ancestors may have appeared in Colonial-era America. He proudly participates as a color guard member of his local chapter of the Sons of American Revolution.
