Recognition – Charles Imondi, ESC Property Manager, recognized new owners and leads for all the activities and events at ESC.

Thank You – To Joan Roy and her committee for helping out with the voting process. The committee handled the registration and processed the votes efficiently and accurately such that there were no meeting holdups.

MHM Communities and Legacy Communities, the two companies who are interested in purchasing ESC joined forces in a joint venture. On Friday, Feb 14, 2025 they provided documents in a Town Hall presentation to Shareholders after the Annual Meeting. Shareholders were given the opportunity to ask questions regarding the proposal. Three documents have been added to the "Documents" sections on the Enchanting Shores website (enchantingshores.com). These Documents include the *MHM Communities Booklet, Your Community, and Sales Sheet*. MHM and Legacy stated they will be offering bus trips to see communities they manage. When the Board receives a Letter of Intent (LOI) to purchase ESC, the Board will meet to approve the LOI. If the LOI is approved, every single shareholder will be notified of a Shareholder Vote. The sale of ESC requires 90% of the Shareholders to vote in favor. The Board will keep the Shareholders informed.



ELEVATE FLORIDA



There is a new program funded by the state through the Florida Disaster Emergency Management Division that is open to all shareholders. It's called the Elevate Florida mitigation program which provides resources including building and materials to elevate your residence to meet the new flood code. Provided you are over the age of 18, you own property in Florida, you are a U. S. Citizen and are willing to contribute up to 25 percent of the project. That criterion basically entitles just about every shareholder in the park who has a structure, to raise their residence. Federal grant funding will cover at least 75 percent of the project cost, meaning property owners only need to invest up to 25 percent—a significant savings. Property owners will be required to provide up to 25% of initial inspection costs prior to inspections being completed. Additionally, the total construction cost for each property will be determined during the initial review period based on factors such as project type, square footage of living space, foundation and construction type, and any necessary project activities. Approved property owners will receive a detailed breakdown of their construction cost share and will have time to decide if they would like to move forward with the project's next phase. The cost-share will also include relocation expenses during construction, meaning the program will pay at least 75 percent of these expenses. 
